The council worked on various issues during the year including the following activities:

- Use of the “Parents Reaching Out Grant” funding secured by the previous year’s council (\$1,000) for to host “Resiliency” presentation with Barbary Evoy. Securing of an additional \$1000 funding for next year’s “Parents Reaching out Grant” to host a “Social media awareness” event with Chris Vollum in November 2016
- Breakfast with Santa event
- Dance-a-thon
- Fundraising to support the purchase of additional chromebooks, ipad minis and new carpets for 3 classrooms
- Installation of the new school sign

These meetings were open to the public to encourage input from parents and other members of the school community.

The purpose of the school council is to help improve student achievement and to enhance the accountability of the education system to parents. School councils are advisory organizations. A school council’s primary means of achieving its purpose is by making recommendations to the principal of the school and the school board. Boards and principals are responsible for considering the recommendations made by each school council and for advising the council of the actions taken in response to the recommendations.

Additional achievements of the school council in 2015/2016 are our fundraising activities, the proceeds of which were used to fund projects in accordance with school board policies. These fund-raising activities are identified below:
