Soft skill deficiencies

- "Young grads today can't write or communicate orally, are weak in math, lack analytical skills and problem solving".
- Employers look for hires with 'soft' or essential skills- communicating, self-confidence, problem-solving, critical thinking and teamwork, "yet this is where employers see students being deficient".
- · 83% of educational institutions believe their grads are equipped for the workforce; 34% of employers agreed and only 44% of students surveyed agreed.

There seems to be a 'disconnect' between what educators teach and what employers want. Who fills this gap?

9 Reasons why Recent University or College graduates are still Living at Home

- 1. In the past 5 years, supply of grads exceeded workforce demand by 50%
- 2. Majority of grads look the same to employers. Must differentiate themselves
- 3. Most grads have little self-awareness; haven't identified their transferrable skills and have little idea of what environments suit them (e.g. indoor/ outdoor? employer/ self employed? etc.)
- 4. No idea of market/job opportunities. 90% of people employed in Ontario work for companies with 500 employees or less. Knowledge of industries and what's important to them is essential in finding work that will be satisfying and fulfilling.
- 5. No networking skills
- 6. Indifferent resumes
- 7. Ineffective use of social media; e.g. have a profile on Linked-in with appropriate photo and bio.
- 8. Poor interviewing skills
- 9. No plan for employment, perseverance and progress measurement

About Ray's Place- a Creemore based Registered Charity; 100% volunteer supported

Vision: "Creemore area youth will secure employment they value, and to remain in, and contribute to our community"

Mission: "Ray's Place encourages and supports Creemore area youth in their pursuit of a post-secondary education and work experience leading to a Diploma, Certificate or Degree'. (Creemore area is generally defined as Clearview and Mulmur Townships)

Objectives:

1. Community Engagement

- -Meet with schools & parents in the catchment area (Creemore PS; Primrose PS; Stayner SS and North Dufferin SS). (Also, communicate with CCI, John Vanier.)
- -Assess needs, concerns and catalogue
- -Maintain continuous dialogue with parents and students

2. Scholarships:

- -1-2x \$20,000 scholarships, payable annually at \$5,000
- -Subject to completed application including financial data

3. Bursaries:

-Generally, a one-time payment of \$1,000 but can be annually

4. Tutorials & Workshops:

- 1. Develop and run depending on specific needs
- -Specialized skills may be hired (e.g. math tutors)
- -Workshops for parents and students focused on employment skills
- Soft skill deficiencies include math, communication, teamwork, problem solving.

5. Summer Work Program:

Find appropriate mechanisms for area youth to link with residents through part time summer employment.
